## Gardening Tips for the locals

Welcome to our new fortnightly garden section. We hope the tips are helpful and make a difference in your garden!

Happy Gardening!

Nature is providing us with the gift of the most wonderful compost available to us in the form of falling Autumn leaves. DON'T waste them - rake them up and put into a separate heap - ie a netted area especially just for leaves. Keep adding to, as leaves become available from now on - before the wind blows them away. Leave exposed to winter weather - they will break down for use in the spring/summer. This is natures way to replenish our clay soils, full of nutrients and worms essential for healthy soil structure and the worms and plants just thrive on it. Also a good time to attack your rotted down compost heap - made from summer wastes and spread it over vegy garden so the winter rains can wash nutrients into the soil. Happy Gardening.
